How to apply?	Students who have been nominated by their home institutions and accepted will receive an e-mail with the steps to follow and provide those documents on our platform: • CV • Learning Agreement (choice of courses) • Language certificate (minimum B1 in French and/or B2 English depending on the chosen courses) • Transcript of the graduate studies records with a min of 2.7/4 GPA accompanied by an official certificate from the home university stating the student's GPA or equivalent academic grade.

Visa	European citizens do not need a visa to study in Europe. All Non-European students must have a valid VISA. In order to apply for it, they must receive an admission letter which is sent upon acceptance. Language skills	All students enrolled in an exchange program must have a minimum level of B1 in the language of instruction for French and B2 for English. All students enrolled in an exchange program leading to a diploma of the Faculty of Economics and Management must have a minimum level of B2 in the language of instruction.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Academic Calendar	The Fall Semester starts the first week of September until the end of December. <i>Please notice, that exceptionally some exams could take place in January 2026.</i> The Spring Semester starts the first week of January until the end of June. No second-chance exams for Master's students. Bachelor's: second session in June. Transcripts are sent by email once all grades are in: by March (Fall) / July (Spring).
Welcome events	The Head Office of international relations proposes several events to welcome the foreign students.
Number of credits and grading system	Undergraduate and graduate : 30 ECTS/semester, 60 ECTS/Year - Bachelor's degrees : 3 years, 180 ECTS - Master's degrees : 1 year = 60 ECTS, 2 years = 120 ECTS Partner Universities will receive the final transcript of records according to the ECTS grading system (from A to F)
Course Prerequisites	Most courses have specific prerequisites. The following academic background is required: For 3rd year Bachelor's courses: Minimum 2 years of studies in Economics or Management. Master's 1st & 2nd year courses: Minimum 3 years of studies in Economics or Management.
Language of instruction	French B1 minimum for French taught courses or English B2 minimum for those who have chosen courses taught in English in their Learning agreement.
Learning agreement	The Department of Economics and Management proposes different Bachelors and Masters programs. Students are required to take at least 80% of their courses within the same program in order to avoid timetable overlaps. Students must select one single campus (Aix-en-Provence or Marseille). Commuting between the two cities is not permitted.
